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# Homeopathic Medicine on Malaria treatment, a Possible Odyssey

Is it possible to treat the malaria with homeopathic medicine?

Which one is the principal benefit of using homeopathic medicine as treatment in case of Malaria?

This parasitic disease appears in 90 countries and infects one of every 10 persons. (BBC 21/Sept/2003)

The World Health Organization indicates that the African Region is the most affected by malaria and accounts for about 86% of the estimated 247 millions malaria episodes worldwide in 2006 and 91 % of the malaria deaths for the same year. The direct and indirect economic costs of malaria are still high in Sub-Saharan Africa.

Although there is a general agreement on cost effective interventions for malaria prevention and control, most countries are implementing either single or multiple interventions piecemeal but are yet to scale up for impact.

In Chad, Africa, the cost of treatment with Fansidar (artemisinin-piprimetamina) by person is between \$ 2 and \$ 7, but the percapita income is U.S. \$ 16 per month, families are of 6-7 members. The medical clinic is located at a distance of 17-30 kms. The nearest hospital is at 50-60 km.

With homeopathic medicine could be just to \$ .20 cents per person.

The homeopathic medicine would bring a better access to treatment, and a cheaper and easier distribution and with better and quick results in the recovery of the health.
